CHATRAPATI SHIVAJI TERMINUS - MUMBAI, MAHARASHTRA

The Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus, a historic railway station formerly known as Victoria Terminus, functions as the headquarters of the Central Railway and is in the city of Mumbai, India. This UNESCO World Heritage Site has become a symbol of the commercial city of India that is known as 'Gothic City' after it. Built in 1887 to commemorate the golden jubilee of Queen Victoria, this station lies in Mumbai's Bori Bunder area.

LOCATION

Located in Mumbai, one of the busiest cities of India, the terminus is the main railhead located in the heart of the city in an area called Bori Bandar. The most important intersection of this port city houses this railway terminus, which holds significance as one of the famous historical buildings of the city.

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE

The monument, designed by Fredrick William Stevens, reflects a blend of Victorian Italianate Gothic Revival style and traditional Mughal style of architectures. Influences of traditional Indian architecture are also present. The stone dome, pointed arches, the ground plan and turrets has close proximity with traditional palace structures of India. The wood carvings, ornamented brass and iron railings, grills of ticket counters, tiles, the decorated balusters of the staircases and several other ornamental works were done by students of Sir Jamsetjee Jeejebhoy School of Art.

The 19th century station stands as an example of excellent and advanced technical and structural solutions of that time. Marked as one of the finest products of industrial and technological revolution merged with a splendid fusion of Gothic-Indian architecture, this terminus was built applying high level of civil and railway engineering. The structure includes a 330-foot-long platform, with a connected car shed that is 1,200 feet in length. The large rooms of the building, with high ceilings, are placed in a series.



PURI JAGANNATH TEMPLE IN PURI, ODISHA -

The flag atop the temple always flaps in the opposite direction of the air. In the temple kitchen, more wonder awaits. Seven pots are placed one top of another. Cooked by firewood, it's the content of the pot placed at the top that magically gets cooked first



BRIHADESHWARA TEMPLE IN THANJAVUR, TAMIL NADU -

Being one of the tallest temples in the world, another interesting fact is, the Viman (the tower above the Sanctum Sanctorum) does not cast a shadow at noon during any part of the year.



AJANTA & ELLORA CAVES IN AURANGABAD, MAHARASHTRA -

One of the biggest and the most impressive rock temple complexes in the world, the Ellora Caves belong to three religions - Hinduism, Buddhism and Jainism.



KUMBHALGARH FORT IN UDAIPUR, RAJASTHAN -

The 36-km long wall of the Kumbhalgarh Fort is the second largest continuous wall in the world, next to the Great Wall of China. The width of wall varies from 15-25 feet and it has been constructed 1914 metres above sea level.



PHILOMENA'S CHURCH IN MYSORE, KARNATAKA -

This Catholic Church, built in honour of St.Philomena was constructed in 1936. The Cologone Cathedral in Germany inspired the Neo-Gothic style and architecture of the Church. It is considered as Asia's second largest church.
